Hearing, Seeing, and Believing

I. God speaks much more than people think. The problem is on our end. Hearing is from the heart.

- A. Quote from a frustrated spiritual seeker: "It seems to me that an all-powerful God could do a much better job of convincing people of His existence than any evangelist ever does...just write it in the sky, nice and big: 'Here's your proof, Ed. Believe in me or go to hell!' Sincerely, The Almighty" (The Case for Faith, Lee Strobel).
- B. God speaks every day through what he has made (Psalm 19:1-4; Romans 1:18-23).

II. How critical it is to respond in faith when God speaks!

- A. Healing and salvation are in the balance (Matthew 13:13-17).
- B. Our identity, calling and ministry to the world are at stake (Luke 10:17-24)
- C. John records a dramatic moment when God revealed himself by speaking out loud (John 12:27-34).
- D. Most missed it, and the door closed. "Some said it thundered" (John 12:29).

III. Expecting the unexpected.

- A. God speaks in all sorts of ways "for our benefit" (John 12:30).
- B. To hear and believe we must settle the fact that God's ways and thoughts are not our ways and thoughts (Isaiah 55:8, 9).
- C. The diversity of ways God speaks
 - 1. The language of the Scriptures: "The more of the written word (the *logos*) we have in our hearts, the greater capacity we have to hear the spoken word (the rhema)" (Bill Johnson; Matthew 4:4).
 - 2. The audible and inaudible voice of God
 - 3. Impressions
 - 4. Dreams and Visions: open, dreamlike, mind pictures (Numbers 12:6-8)
 - 5. Symbols, riddles, unusual circumstances
 - 6. Prophecy and Testimonies

IV. Love opens our ears. It secures our souls and casts out fear so we can hear.

- A. The Father and Son were partners (John 5:19, 20).
- B. Reading I Corinthians 13:4-7 in the light of your relationship with God.
- C. In great relationships between children and parents, sister-to-sister, or wives and husbands, the communication circuits are all wide open. For the Christian who feels God's love, life is just one big microphone from God.

V. Growing in our believing and hearing—remembering the past

- A. At first, the miracles did not help the first disciples to grow in their understanding and experience of God (Mark 6:35-44, 49-52; 8:1-10, 14-21).
- B. A poor memory causes the heart to harden (Mark 8:17, 18).

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
