

Releasing the Great and Unsearchable Plans of God

Jeremiah 33:1-11

I. Even while Jeremiah was in prison, God invited him into the “great and unsearchable things” He had for Jeremiah and the nation of Israel. This is a picture of the destiny and privilege of all believers (John 10:10).

- A. The “Call to Me” of Jeremiah 33:3 is God’s invitation for every believer to pray and expect “great and unsearchable things,” even in difficult times (Romans 8:28, 31-39.)
- B. Sounds of joy and gladness are a promise for your life, despite contrary circumstances. The Lord is an expert at restoring our happiness and future (Jeremiah 33:10-11).

II. When Jesus came, He released “great and unsearchable” revelation to His Church about their authority in the world; and He continues to do so.

- A. We stand as kings, priests, and prophets to the nations (I Peter 2:9-10).
 - 1. We pray, “Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth...” (Matthew 6:10).
 - 2. We ask, seek, and knock with “shameless audacity” (Luke 11:9-13).
 - 3. We bind and loose on the earth and in the heavens (Matthew 18:18-20).
 - 4. We come boldly to a throne of grace (Hebrews 4:16).
- B. Because of the authority Jesus gives us, our job is to make disciples of nations with the prayer, power, and love He gives us (Matthew 28:18-20). Making disciples makes the world better in every area of life (Matthew 5:13-16).

III. God wants to reveal “great and unsearchable” plans to us that bless His heart and the earth (Jeremiah 33:1-3).

- A. “It is the glory of God to conceal a matter; to search out a matter is the glory of kings” (Proverbs 25:2). We are those kings.
- B. We are the “salt of the earth” and the “light of the world” (Matthew 5:13-16).
- C. The good, accessible, revealed plans God has for us, individually and corporately (Jeremiah 29:11; John 10:10)
 - 1. God intends for us to overcome the works of Satan (Luke 10:17-24).
 - 2. God wants us to be problem solvers in the world (James 1:5-8).
 - 3. In these last days, God is increasingly bringing strategies and power to bless the world and disciple the nations (Acts 1:8).
 - 4. God freely gives revelation of His overwhelmingly love for us and the world (Ephesians 3:16-21).
 - 5. God gives power to heal the brokenhearted, just as Jesus did (Isaiah 61:1-3).
 - 6. We rebuild devastated cities and receive a double portion (Isaiah 61:4-7).
 - 7. God gives us power to move mountains (Matthew 21:21-22).
